FIRST READING: Isaiah 2:1-5

The vision of Isaiah son of Amoz, concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In the days to come the mountain of the Temple of the Lord shall tower above the mountains and be lifted higher than the hills. All the nations will stream to it, peoples without number will come to it; and they will say: 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the Temple of the God of Jacob that he may teach us his ways so that we may walk in his paths; since the Law will go out from Zion, and the oracle of the Lord from Jerusalem.' He will wield authority over the Nations and adjudicate between many peoples; these will hammer their swords into ploughshares, their spears into sickles. Nation will not lift sword against nation, there will be no more training for war. O House of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Ps 121:1-2. 4-5. 6-9. R. see v.1. (R.) Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

- 1. I rejoiced when I heard them say: 'Let us go to God's house.' And now our feet are standing within your gates, O Jerusalem. (R.)
- 2. It is there that the tribes go up, the tribes of the Lord. For Israel's law it is, there to praise the Lord's name. There were set the thrones of judgement of the house of David. (R.)
- 3. For the peace of Jerusalem pray: 'Peace be to your homes! May peace reign in your walls, in your palaces, peace!' (R.)
- 4. For love of my brethren and friends I say: 'Peace upon you!'
 For love of the house of the Lord I will ask for your good. (R.)

SECOND READING: Romans 13:11-14

You know 'the time' has come: you must wake up now: our salvation is even nearer than it was when we were converted. The night is almost over, it will be daylight soon – let us give up all the things we prefer to do under the cover of the dark; let us arm ourselves and appear in the light. Let us live decently as people do in the daytime: no drunken orgies, no promiscuity or licentiousness, and no wrangling or jealousy. Let your armour be the Lord Jesus Christ.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Psalm 84:8

Alleluia, alleluia!
Lord, show us your mercy and love, and grant us your salvation.
Alleluia!

GOSPEL: Matthew 24:37-44

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As it was in Noah's day, so will it be when the Son of Man comes. For in those days before the Flood people were eating, drinking, taking wives, taking husbands, right up to the day Noah went into the ark, and they suspected nothing till the Flood came and swept all away. It will be like this when the Son of Man comes. Then of two men in the fields one is taken, one left; of two women at the millstone grinding, one is taken, one left. 'So stay awake, because you do not know the day when your master is coming. You may be quite sure of this that if the householder had known at what time of the night the burglar would come, he would have stayed awake and would not have allowed anyone to break through the wall of his house. Therefore, you too must stand ready because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'

1st Sunday of Advent, Year A: An Article by Fr Dominic,

In the First Reading, we are to go up the mountain to be near the Lord and in the Gospel, we are not to wander away from God through sin. St. Paul's fascination with salvation is not due to forgiveness of our sins, instead it is with the universal event that God has worked for us that then allows us to call God our Father. St. Paul is sure that now is a time when the Kingdom of God is active and growing. This is Isaiah's 'mountain of the Lord's house.' The night will be fully over when Jesus comes again, until then we are to put on the armour of light, which is faith, hope, and charity. There is a mistaken belief that when Christ comes again the kingdom of God will be established. In fact, it has already been established with his resurrection. It will be completed with his second coming. Like our own death, this can happen at any time. Because his kingdom has begun, we can act as true children of God. If we have died to sin, we are living in a time of night turning into day. Hearing that our God allows much destruction and is also coming to judge and condemn, might cause people to despair and even doubt Him, and also cause us to forget that he sent his only Son so that we might have eternal life. This is what God truly wants. Indeed, it is through living a life that is founded on the love of God, knowing that love is the reason for what God has done, that we are able to walk in the light of Christ as his spotless Church. Love is the motive for the way God the Father revealed his Son—our hope in God shapes the way we live and die.
