FIRST READING: Malachi 3:19-20

The day is coming now, burning like a furnace; and all the arrogant and the evil-doers will be like stubble. The day that is coming is going to burn them up, says the Lord of hosts, leaving them neither root nor stalk. But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness will shine out with healing in its rays.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Ps 97:5-9. R. see v.9 (R.) The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice.

- 1. Sing psalms to the Lord with the harp with the sound of music. With trumpets and the sound of the horn acclaim the King, the Lord. (R.)
- 2. Let the sea and all within it, thunder; the world, and all its peoples. Let the rivers clap their hands and the hills ring out their joy at the presence of the Lord. (R.)
- 3. For the Lord comes, he comes to rule the earth. He will rule the world with justice and the peoples with fairness. (R.)

SECOND READING: 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

You know how you are supposed to imitate us: now we were not idle when we were with you, nor did we ever have our meals at anyone's table without paying for them; no, we worked night and day, slaving and straining, so as not to be a burden on any of you. This was not because we had no right to be, but in order to make ourselves an example for you to follow. We gave you a rule when we were with you: not to let anyone have any food if he refused to do any work. Now we hear that there are some of you who are living in idleness, doing no work themselves but interfering with everyone else's. In the Lord Jesus Christ, we order and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Luke 21:28

Alleluia, alleluia! Lift up your heads and see; your redemption is near at hand. Alleluia!

GOSPEL Luke 21:5-19

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke Your endurance will win you your life. When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are staring at now - the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed.' And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said, 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?' 'Take care not to be deceived,' he said, 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened for this is something that must happen but the end is not soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven. 'But before all this happens, men will seize you And persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'

Fr Dominic's biweekly Article:

Jesus is trying to encourage greater faith in the disciples and all who read this Gospel. He is also trying to ensure that they remain vigilant in the face of any sort of resistance. As disciples, we can endure our own passion and even during ill health we can undergo own moments of doubt and of loneliness when we need comfort. We can provide reassurance and support in times of crisis to people who feel lost and abandoned. This is a way of making people see God in times of distress through seeing a humanity that bears fruit by just reassuring others through our presence and care. In Pope Benedict XVI book *Jesus of Nazareth*, he says, "when Jesus says he has manifested God's name and that he will manifest it further, he is not speaking of some new word that he has communicated to people as a particularly fortunate title for God. The revelation of the name is a new mode of God's presence among people, a radically new way in which God makes his home with them. In Jesus, God gives himself entirely into the world of humanity: whoever sees Jesus [then also] sees the Father" (Vol. 2, p. 91). Having heard the Pope say this we can see that the promise of God's name, as a new mode of existence with them here on earth, is a rather stark contrast for those about to witness destruction: how can God become present in a new way in a collapsing world? Over time, the disciples came to understand the resurrection as it applied

to Jesus and to us. The central message is to not lose heart even when all seems to be lost. God is still in control and his admission that some things will look like he is not in control, is an admission that we are going to have to face things in such a way that it looks like we have been abandoned. It is then that our faith will be exercised and will grow.



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
